Dear Highland family,

That day we'll be joined by colleagues and friends from the Presbytery of Mid-Kentucky (and beyond) and with liturgy and vows and prayer my pastoral call to Highland will be formalized. It's the final step in that process from nominee to installed pastor. As we move forward from here, God help us to be a creative, openhearted, adaptively faithful Christian community that blesses the world around us.

We staff also want to say a tremendous thank you to everyone who worked on renovating the church offices and the children's ministry areas. If you haven't been in the office recently, come say hi and enjoy the updated paint, lighting, refinished floors, carpet, furniture, kitchenette, and so much more. For those of us who work in the offices, this is a big quality-of-life upgrade. Our spaces have been transformed from tired and shabby and cluttered to clean and graceful and inviting. And the brilliant volunteer(!) managers of the whole project have been Donna Perry, Susan Grubbs, and Janet Raderer. They have offered masterful communication, efficiency, and clarity of vision. Our enduring gratitude to all three of them!

The offices and children's ministry areas are not only more attractive — now they are far more useable and flexible for doing the work of the church. In that spirit of practical mission, for what other HPC spaces might we find a renewed vision? Kitchen and dining hall? Fellowship Hall? Youth spaces? Sanctuary? (By the way, the sanctuary will get a small upgrade later this year as we hang a couple of microphones from the ceiling to replace the ones on stands in the middle of the sanctuary. We'll also update the audio system for better control of the sound in the room and on the live stream.)

Sometimes the work of the church involves tending microphones and paint. Sometimes it means an intergenerational group gathering to send our middle schoolers off to their retreat at Massanetta. And weekly our work includes worship together and unpacking scripture that helps us become more Christlike. Hope to see you at church soon!

## Dare to Care Food Bank

**Dare to Care Mobile Food Pantries** - While we do not want anyone to volunteer for something that they do not feel comfortable doing, we want the congregation to know that the two Mobile Food Pantries that we have connections with (Portland Avenue and Grace Hope) are still running once a month. (Portland – **Tuesday, August 1** at 9:45 am; Smoketown – **Tuesday, August 15** at 1:30 pm) Dare to

Care has a finely tuned system where all food pick up is non-contact, social distancing is enforced, and LOTS of safety measures are being upheld. This has been crucial for the populations that we serve because it is allowing them free nutritious food in a time when many of them have lost income and are surrounded by uncertainty. We want to thank the volunteers who help keep our partnerships going during this difficult time.

**Welcoming our Burmese Family!** We are once again co-sponsoring a refugee family through Kentucky Refugee Ministries. We have been assigned a Burmese family of 5; mom, dad, and three sons, age 3, 10, and 13. They are set to arrive on Wednesday, August 9th at 7:00 pm. Over the next few weeks we will be setting up their apartment, shopping for groceries, and cooking them a welcome meal. We'll be helping them learn English and navigate their first few months in America. 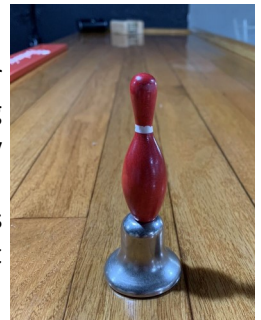

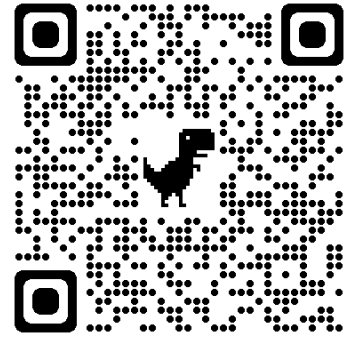

## Environmental Stewardship

Sarah Lynn Cunningham taught a class on Greening Your Home and Church during the Sunday School hour on July 16th. During this presentation, she gave many good ideas on how we can each lessen our carbon footprint, and – possibly, even more important – how we can save money. Her number one starting point was “sealing the envelope.” This means, finding the cracks in your home that are not keeping it insulated well and seal them. If we can create a tight seal first, then we can move on to accessing resources for environmental sustainability in our homes and businesses. The next simple step might include getting a programable thermostat so that you use less energy while you are away or at night and then are able to have it more “comfortable” while you are at home. With this heat wave, there are lots of little things that we can do before we crank down the entire HVAC system. Remember to check the weather stripping and fix your windows if needed, replace your HVAC filters, use your blinds and curtains to keep the interior space cooler, utilize fans, and don’t run unnecessary appliances – try cooking with a crock pot or instant pot instead of the oven.
