Session Summary

Report from the November 2023 Session Meeting

The session elected Sallie Stevens as Clerk of Session.

From Property: The Session approved the allocation of \$100,000 from the Memorial Fund to match the \$100,000 already committed by the Nursery and Weekday School for renovations to the Walker-Nevin Building. These renovations will include new flooring, LED lighting, low-flow toilets and cabinets for classrooms. This project will also include the hiring of a short-term, part-time project manager.

STITCH NEWS

On Tuesday afternoon, **December 12**, from 12 noon to 3:00 pm, the students and volunteers of STITCH are hosting an Open House and Sale. STITCH is a ministry of Highland Pres with Kentucky Refugee Ministries and for over 13 years we have been teaching refugee women to sew. These women have been able to use their new skills to make items to sell, while sewing at STITCH, and also in their homes. This helps them supplement their family income. One hundred percent of the sales go directly to the women who create the items. Please stop by and shop from their amazing selection of handcrafted items: purses, tote bags, hats, scarves, aprons, microwave bowl potholders, pillows, table runners, baby items and Christmas items.

STITCH is located in the Pleune-Mobley Center. Enter the building from the church parking lot on the lower level near the orange recycling cans. Take the elevator to the third floor.


Nursery and Weekday School

Pageant with BEAUTFIFUL singing by your children-11:00am, December 24 - Yes, that's Christmas Eve! Bring your whole family!



Pledges & Gifts - All year end gifts, Operating Pledge, Special Offerings, and Designated Gift payments to Highland Presbyterian Church should be postmarked or in the church office by December 31, 2023, to be recognized as charitable gifts for tax purposes in 2023.

HPC Online Pledge Payments - Please remember if you pay your 2024 pledge online in 2023 to use "Advance Pledge" on www.hpclouisville.org and click on the "Give" link. The memo boxes to the right of the dollar amounts are available for you to add a donation description like "2023 Pledge".

Gifts of Stock - Because we believe in being good stewards of what God has entrusted to us, we encourage you to thoughtfully consider the advantages of giving stock to Highland Presbyterian Church. If you own appreciated stock, it is almost always better to contribute stock than cash. By giving appreciated stock to a charitable organization, you avoid paying capital gains tax on the increased value of the stock. Because you are giving to a charitable organization, your gift is deductible for the market value of the stock at the time it was given. Many of our members have found that giving appreciated stock to the church makes very good sense. Please ask your financial advisor if this is a viable option for you. Highland Presbyterian Church's policy is to immediately sell all stock gifts and deposit the proceeds from the sale into the church bank account.

Environmental Stewardship

Heat Pumps for Additions and Homes Without Air Ducts Homes with converted attics, porches, or additions can effectively heat and cool using ductless air-source heat pumps called mini-splits. You may have heard of them but didn't realize they are heat pumps, one of the most energy efficient methods available for making homes comfortable.

A mini-split can also be used to air condition and heat your home if you do not have air ducts. Mini-splits are small, flexible units with outdoor air-source heat pumps and indoor wall elements. Worth noting, mini-split owners tend to become enthusiasts. In addition to single space units, models that can heat and cool up to four rooms – each with its own thermostat – are available with one outdoor unit. Mini-splits lose no heat due to ductwork heat loss, making them even more efficient than ducted air-source heat pumps. Initially mini-splits are more expensive than a conventional cooling and heating choice but use about 30 percent of the energy of a conventional system, providing homeowners savings over time. Notably, Federal tax credits are available for heat pumps. For information about adopting mini-split heat pumps, contact an experienced installer. His performances have included the world premiere performance and recording of Caccini's La Liberazione di Ruggiero with Ars Femina; the Durufle Requiem, Rutti Requiem, Britten Cantata misericordium, and Britten's War Requiem with the Louisville Choral Arts Society; Bach's Christmas Oratorio with The Blanche Moyse Chorale. He is Director of Worship & Music Ministries at Second Presbyterian Church.



Samuel Libra is Organist and Assistant Director of Worship & Music at Second Presbyterian Church of Louisville. A native of Minnesota, he graduated from Luther College in Iowa, where he studied church music with Dr. Gregory Peterson, and completed graduate studies at the University of Washington with Dr. Carole Terry. Dr. Libra can regularly heard in worship and concert accompanying and performing solo works on piano, harpsichord, and organ. His research has focused on the 19th and early 20th centuries, especially the intersection between the form and genre, especially in the music of Charles-Marie Widor.
