#### "...that your joy may be complete."

As I write this Christmastide is still upon us, and I'm full of gratitude for gifts offered this season at Highland. Liturgists from youth to sage blessed us with worship leadership, scripture read thoughtfully, candles lit in hope. Our children (with Rhonda's magnificent team shepherding them) retold how Jesus came into the world. Singers and instrumentalists heightened our Advent anticipation and then loosed joy into the Christmas Eve services. Artists gifted us with new banners and bulletin covers for the season. Scholars and poets helped us hear the ancient stories freshly.

Mary births Jesus, God bless her, away from any spotlight. Even as a newborn, though, Jesus becomes a gravitational center, someone who draws others in: animals, family, shepherds, magi. "Wise women also came," poet Jan Richardson reminded us. Jesus still does that — gathers us up into his community. That's another gift for which I thank God.

When we shared the Lord's Supper at the 9:00pm Christmas Eve service, I experienced the gift of looking into each face as I served the bread. Catching eyes in that brief moment, I saw your shining faces, families regathered, connections both human and spiritual. God's presence winds its way through the centuries — from the Bethlehem stable to faithful hearts congregating in Christ's name even now, even here.

And here and now it's 2024. We don't know what this new year will bring. Stilling of gunfire or more violence? Competency or chaos in our political system? Newly serious efforts to reduce environmental disaster? A renewed sense of missional direction for Highland Presbyterian Church?

We do know that both joys and griefs will abound. Through it all we walk together as Christ's people. The communion meal we share is one sign of his generous renewing power. Our church has been exploring and learning about this sacrament that's also called the Eucharist, which means "thanksgiving." In early fall last year we celebrated the Lord's Supper every Sunday for six weeks, and thereafter the session led us to celebrate it on the first and third Sundays of each month. This month our elected elders again will reflect on what we've experienced, and will guide us in setting a communion schedule for the new year.

I also look forward to convening soon an adult education event about the Lord's Supper. We'll look at the history and theology of this ancient Christian practice, and talk about what it can be for us now. Each of us brings our distinct experiences with the sacrament, along with the preferences we have cultivated — and still we can be surprised, transformed as a community when we serve each other in this way.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus invites his friends to share this meal with him, and directs them to keep sharing it with each other to remember his life and his death. Then Jesus offers a long farewell speech, empowering his friends with divine love for life together after he's gone. One of my favorite verses is John 15:11, "I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete." Thanks be to God for that gift, and for all the others.

Dare to Care Mobile Food Pantries: We give great thanks for our ongoing relationships with our Dare to Care Food Pantries! We help Dare to Care provide volunteers for two separate food pantries! Portland Avenue Community Trust is located at 2508 Portland Ave and Grace Hope (Smoketown) is located at 702 E Breckinridge St. This month, the food pantries will take place on Tuesday, January 2

(Portland) at 9:45 am and Tuesday, January 16 (Smoketown) at 1:30 pm. This is a wonderful volunteer opportunity because you only have to give an hour to make a big difference in someone's life. As a volunteer, you will be handing out the food that Dare to Care provides. It's a wonderful way to get to know people in other parts of town and provide a service that is greatly needed.

A Co-Sponsor Christmas! Over the last four months, our refugee co-sponsorship team has been meeting regularly with the Khual family to help them through their transition of moving to America. On Saturday, December 16<sup>th</sup>, our team assembled at the Khual family apartment to carry out our closure meeting (ending our formal co-sponsor role with the family) and to celebrate their success. The family expressed gratitude for all that we have been able to

provide. Team members brought food and gifts for all the family members. (Here's a photo of father and the 2 boys in their new blazers.) This family has a strong bond and capacity to care and love. The father has been working for 3 weeks so far and the boys report doing very well in school, even getting recognition for how good they are performing. We are grateful for the ways this church has cared for the Khual family from the airport entry, the gathering and sorting of household goods and furniture, the apartment cleaning and furniture placement, the meals provided, the visits, the weekly English teaching, the trips to buy clothing for the boys, the contributions of coats and Christmas gifts and keeping them in hearts and minds. Thanks for being part of this HPC mission of service.



## **Environmental Stewardship**

#### **Energy efficient water heaters**

A water heater typically uses 20 percent of a home's energy, the second highest energy expense in your home. When it's time to replace a water heater, there are two practical energy saving options: a heat pump water heater or a tankless water heater. A **heat pump water heater** pays back replacement costs in saved energy in two to four years (depending on whether it replaces a gas or electric water heater), the fastest return on any energy saving home appliance. Heat pump water heaters are sometimes called hybrid water heaters indicating they have back-up resistance water heating to cover peak use periods. A **tankless water heater** takes much longer to pay for itself but is 24 to 34 percent more energy-efficient than a storage tank water heater. Usually both tankless and heat pump water heaters can be installed in the same location as your current water heater. Tax credits are offered for both

choices. As in any major purchase, personal preference and home layout need to be taken into account before purchasing a new energy efficient water heater. Investigate your options before you buy.


