



**EV Myth Busting MYTH:** Electric vehicles are worse for the climate than gasoline cars because of power plant emissions

**FACT:** Electric vehicles have a smaller carbon footprint than gasoline cars, even when the electricity comes from a power grid dependent upon fossil fuels. In Jefferson County **an EV's charging carbon footprint is typically one third of a conventional car's gasoline carbon footprint.** An EV's carbon footprint savings begins with an efficient use of energy; internal combustion engines waste much of their potential energy in heat — often as much as **65 percent of your gasoline powered car's potential energy is lost to heat.**
