Session Summary



Report from the March 2024 Session Meeting

The Session approved the allocation of additional funds from the Memorial Fund for the renovations to the Walker-Nevin Building. In November of 2023, the Session approved the allocation of \$100,000 from the Memorial Fund to match the \$100,000 that had already been committed by the Nursery and Weekday School. These renovations include new flooring, LED lighting, low-flow toilets and cabinets for classrooms.

At the March 20, 2024 meeting, the Session learned of an expected shortfall to the renovation budget of \$200,000. After discussion, the Session approved additional costs not to exceed \$270,000, with the costs in excess of \$200,000 to be split equally with the Nursery and Weekday School.

The Session approved the baptisms of Alexandra and Sylvia Buelt and Jeremiah Luaba to take place on Easter Sunday.



Environmental Stewardship

MYTH: Electric vehicles are worse for the climate than gasoline cars because of battery manufacturing.

FACT: The greenhouse gas emissions associated with an electric vehicle over its lifetime are lower than those from an average gasoline-powered vehicle, even when accounting for manufacturing.*



Vehicle battery longevity is longer than people realize. This writer's hybrid car battery is healthy into its 17th year (143,000 miles). Some car manufacturers **guarantee batteries** in new EVs for ten years. **EV batteries also outlive their vehicle** by providing next generation use as reliable energy storage for solar and wind energy, which is not calculated in the climate impact graph above.
